
China Gets a New Terror: Famine

Reliable Hong Kong reports indicated Northeast China was in the grip of one of its worst famines in decades. Millions faced starvation in an area where more than a third of China's 450 million live (map, r.). The famine was

spreading south

and west.

Background: Victims blamed both Nationalists and Communists for the famine.Causes: conscription of troops, requisitioning of food by both armies, summer drought. fall floods. Next danger: a Red campaign to cut rice supplies to British Hong Kong, now swollen with refguees, and to Malaya, already plagued by revolts.
