

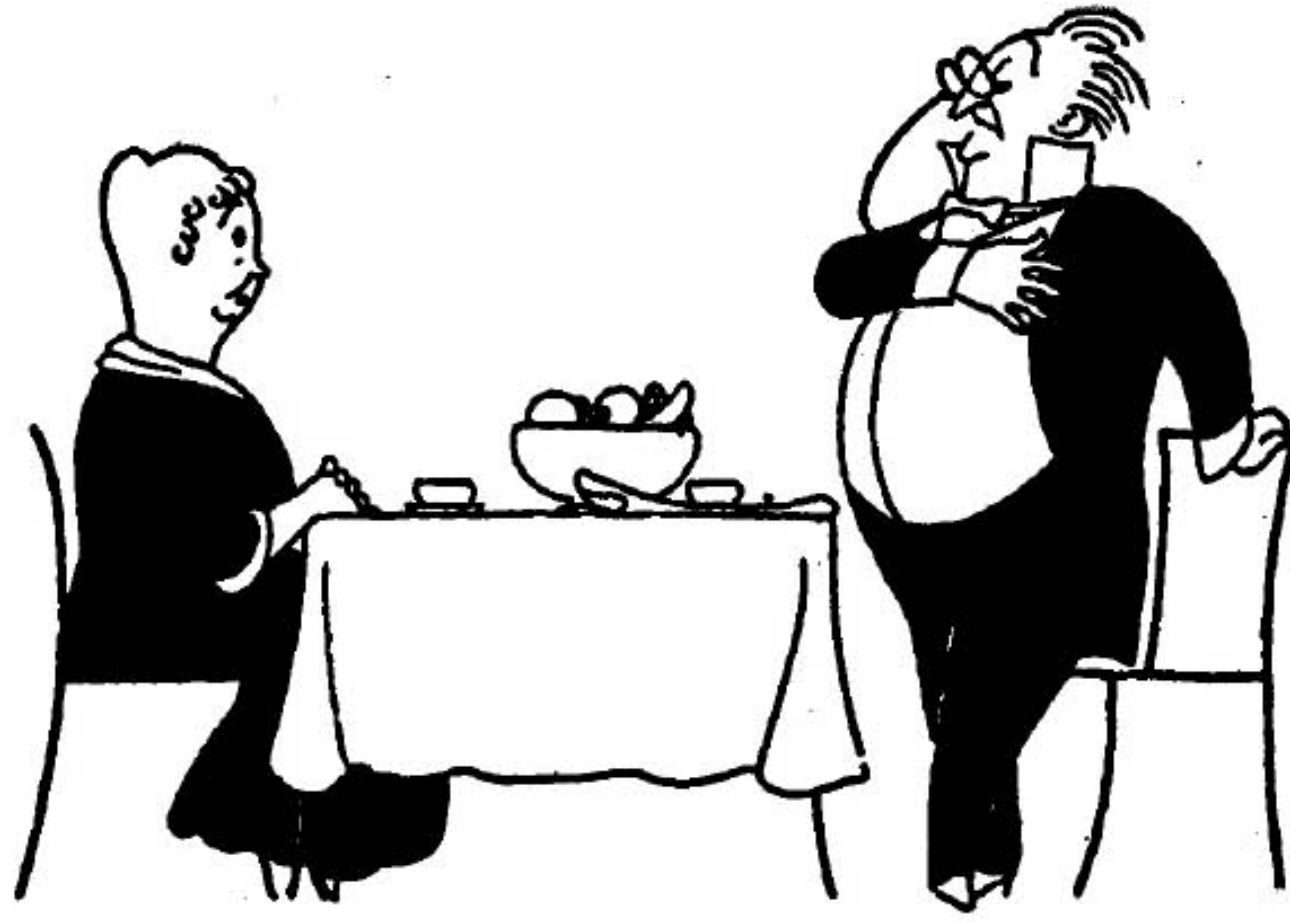

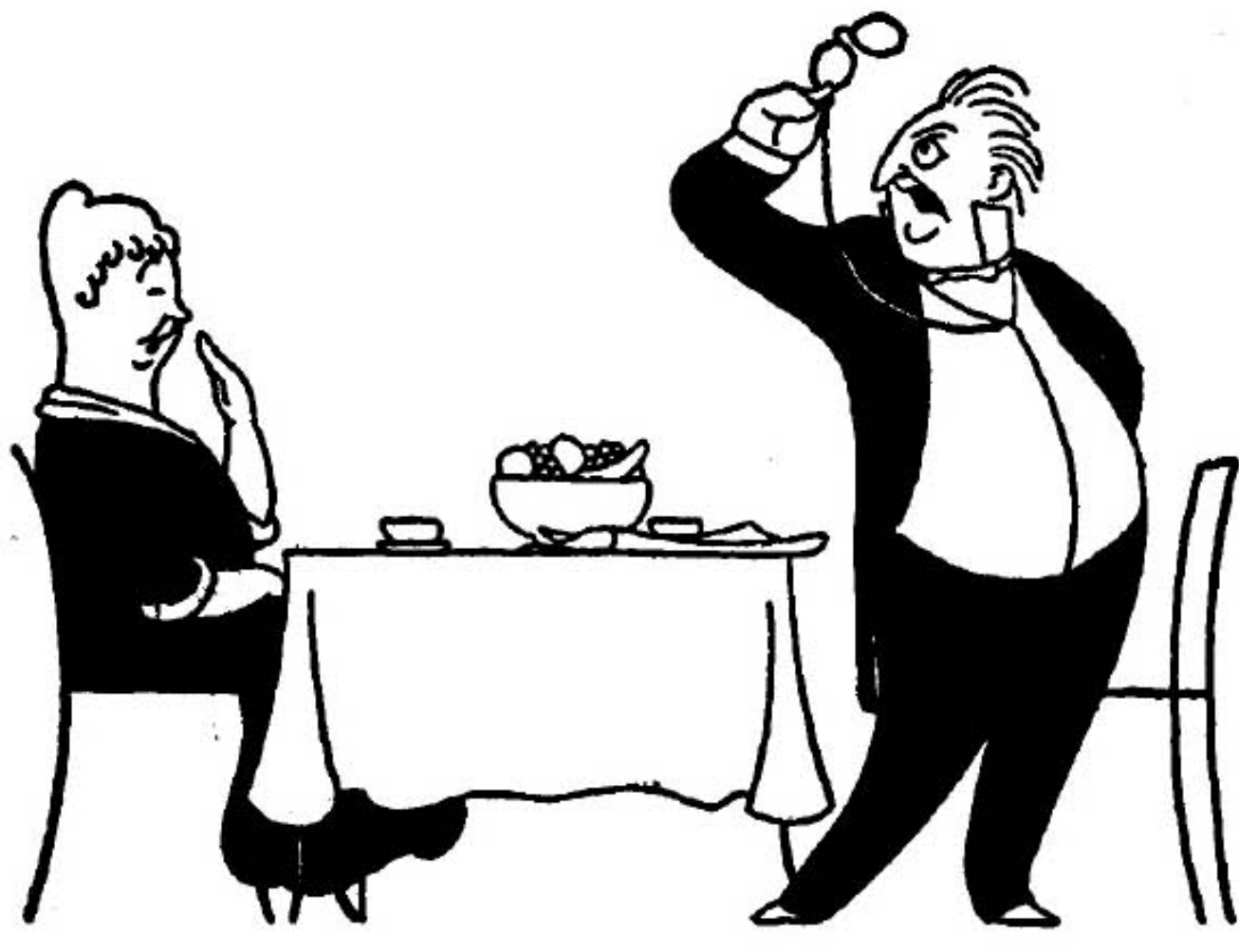
IF SENATORS TALKED AT HOME AS THEY DO IN CONGRESS

"The question at issue is one of Americanism as against un-Americanism, and I, thank God, am one hundred per cent American!" etc.



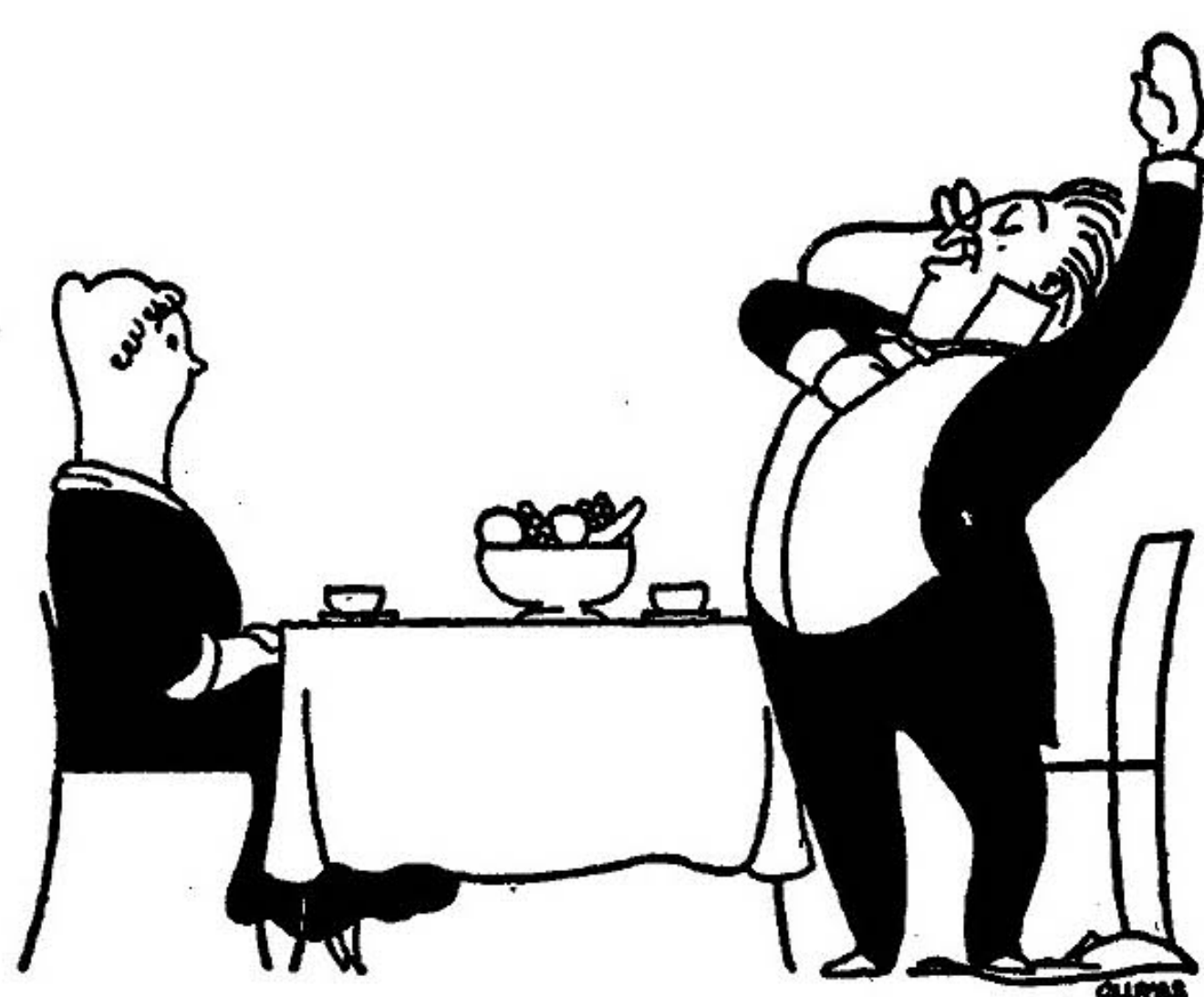
"The matter may seem small to some, but to me it threatens the very foundations of this great and glorious nation," and so forth.
