A New Art Medium

Robert Motherwell's abstract mural, designed originally in oil, was copied in a new medium—"Scotchlite" reflective sheeting—under the artist's supervision (above). Now on display at New York City's Whitney Museum, the mural represents the first

esthetic use of this medium, adding a new dimension to art. The "Scotchlite" mural becomes three different pictures in different lights. The reflective sheeting, made of millions of microscopic glass beads precision-coated to a reflective backing, returns light directly to its source.
