SUSAN MYRICK

WHO WAGED A VERY CIVIL WAR IN HOLLYWOOD FOR THE SOUTH

She is the Georgia newspaperwoman who coached players in the ways of the Old South. Old Southerners had been irritably certain it couldn't be done successfully. Miss Myrick was made technical director of the film because

She spied out anachronisms (some of the complications were colossal) and acted as encyclopedia and authority on every matter.
