
Canada Moves to Check Immigration

LONDON, March 14 (by mail to New York, March 28.—A warning against penniless immigrants going to Canada "to seek their fortune" is contained in a supplemental report of the Dominion's royal commissioners, who have been studying the immigration question.

The commissioners say that in Canada, as in Australia, there is a strong current of opposition to immigration as it is now carried on, particularly among the wage earners in the cities. It is recognized that the development of the land is of prime consideration and that the tide of immigration into cities has created a surplus, whereas the rural communities have suffered.

It is declared that all outward going settlers in the future should have enough money to establish themselves. In any event, says the report, the immigrant must have some capital. The report says that the question of a State-controlled cable between England and Canada for the better dissemination of news is being considered.
