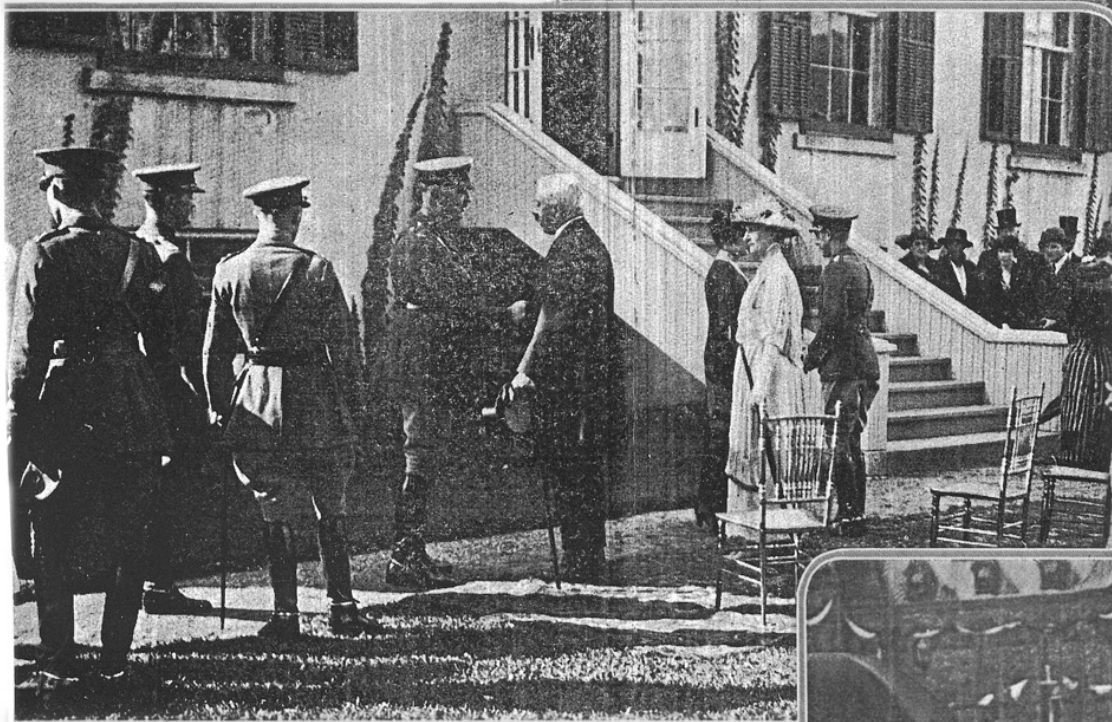
CANADA WELCOMES THE PRINCE OF WALES AS HE SPEEDS ACROSS THE CONTINENT
