The 1915 Covered Caddy Bag

The caddy bag shown on this page is for traveling. It consists of two separate bags, one of which may be fastened to the other in the capacity of cover. This is useful, since it prevents the loss of one's clubs either through accident, or grand larceny—the stealing of golf clubs is grand larceny, isn't it?—and for practical, playing purposes, the cover fits into the lower bag like a lining.
