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WAR MANUFACTORIES AT COLUMBUS, GA.

George J. Burris writes that a very important city was omitted from the list given in the story of how the Confederate States armed their soldiers, January Veteran, and that was his native city of Columbus, Ga., which was largely engaged in that occupation. He says: "Here Louis Haiman & Bros. were engaged in making swords for the cavalry, also revolvers harness for teams and artillery horses, besides accounterment for the infantry. Greenwood & Gray manufactured rifles and swords. The Naval Iron Works, as well as the Arsenal made brass cannon and many other useful articles needed by the army. Our mills turned our thousands of yards of jeans for uniforms, which were cut out and made here. A large shoe factory was also maintained here, besides various other smaller industries making army supplies."

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
