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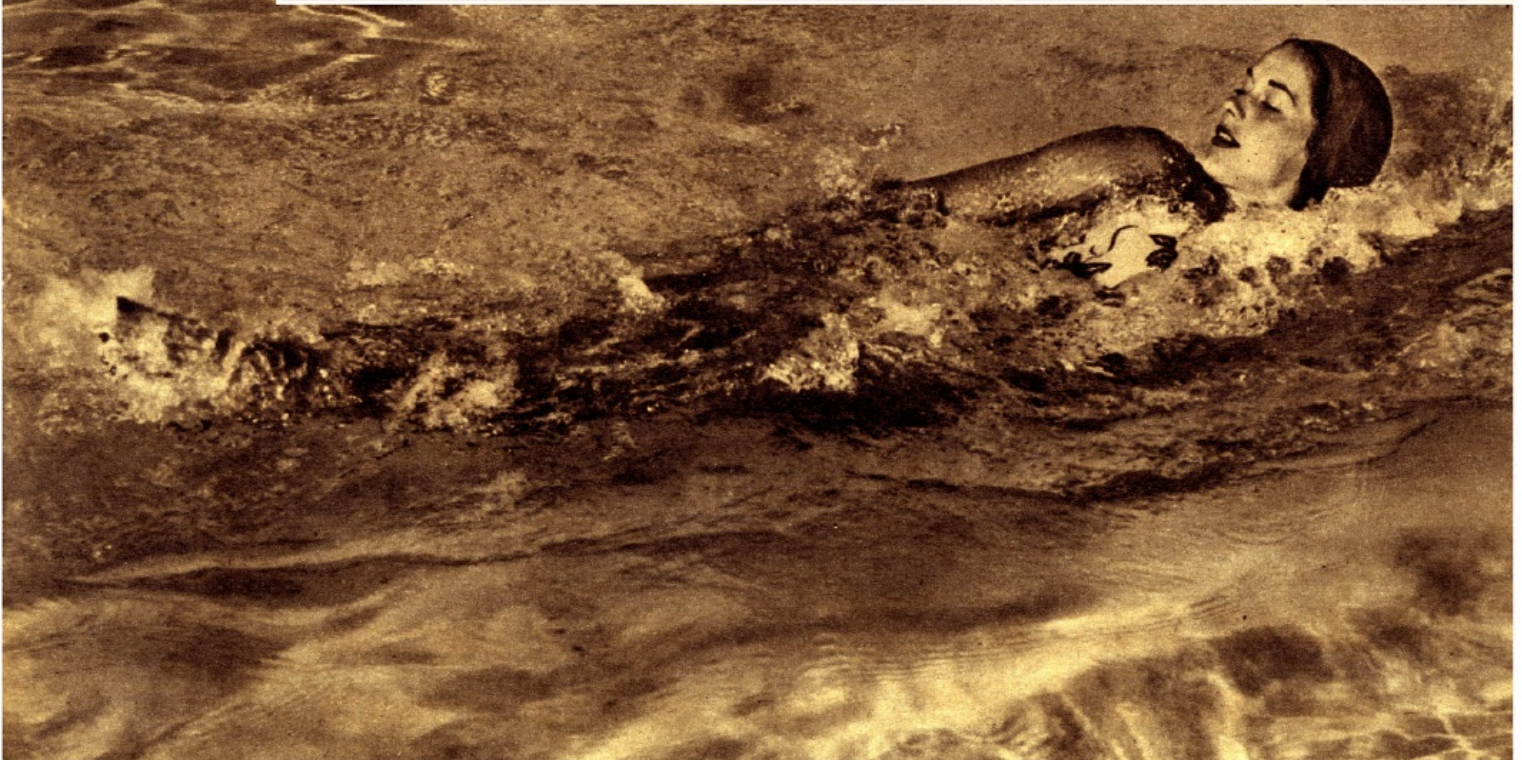

FREQUENT TENNIS OPPONENT OF JINX, though not in her class as a player, is equally shapely cinema actress Paulette Goddard. Here they relax after a hard set at the Tennis Club. Modeling brings Jinx top rates, about \$20 an hour (standard rate: \$5). Fairly steady posing assignments plus an occasional movie job bring her a tidy \$10,000 a year.



NOT CONTENT with just being "the most beautiful girl in Hollywood" (and that's saying something), a tennis of tournament calibre, and a par golfer, bronze-skinned Jinx is a streak in the water. She comes by her athletic prowess honestly: her father was a football hero, her mother was women's singles tennis champ of Chile and her two 'teen-aged brothers hold first-ten rankings in the Boys' National Singles. Jinx, who in two short years has become one of the most competent models in America, is the All-American Girl come true. In short, brother, there goes a WOMAN!

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
